"Students reading this translation will have no doubt of the passion and issues raised by the plays," said Elaine Fantham, Professor Emerita of Princeton. Johnston's translations of the classic Greek plays have been used in numerous dramatic performances, including at Oxford University.

These latest works follow by less than 3 months the release of his translations of Kant's Universal Natural History and Theory of the Heavens and Georges Cuvier's Discourse on the Revolutionary Upheavals on the Surface of the Earth. Not previously available, this important work might otherwise have been lost Later this year the publisher will release Johnston's translation of Ovid's Metamorphoses followed by works of Rousseau and more by Aristophanes. In 2006, his translations of the Iliad and the Odyssey in a modern English poetic form were released and reviewed on NPR.
